

Construction and Demolition (C&D) Materials

There is much C&D “waste” can be reused or recycled. Local and statewide law requires that recyclables and some C&D materials **must be** recycled instead of landfilled.

Landfill Ban

All C&D projects in the Greater Upper Valley Solid Waste Management District **must** separate the following materials* from landfill-bound waste on the job site:

- **Plywood**
Clean & unpainted only
- **OSB – Oriented Strand Board**
Clean & unpainted only
- **Asphalt shingles**
Asbestos-free only
- **Scrap metal**
- **Clean lumber & pallets**
- **Mandatory recyclables**
Including cardboard (which must be kept clean & dry) and beverage containers
- **Drywall**
From certain sized projects (Call 802.674.4474)

*This is a list of banned C&D items only. Paints, stains, and any other materials considered hazardous are also banned from the landfill.

Anyone putting these items into a container with landfill-bound material, and any hauling company that picks up a dumpster or roll-off box containing these items mixed with landfill bound material is subject to enforcement action.

Burning or burying construction and demolition waste is illegal due to the possibility of releasing toxins into the air and/or ground water.
