Household Hazardous Waste Collections

ACCEPTED:

- Waste oil
- All paints, varnishes, stains
- Antifreeze + other auto fluids
- Cleaners
- Pool chemicals
- Pesticides + herbicides
- Solvents
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Mercury-containing devices (thermostats, thermometers, etc.)

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Empty paint cans (go in scrap metal)
- Medical Waste
- Ammunition
- Empty Containers (go in trash)
- Smoke Detectors (Throw away after battery removal)
- Fire extinguishers
- Propane tanks
- Computers

Fluorescent Bulbs

Tubes and CFLs contain mercury. Please do not throw them in your trash. The following locations accept bulbs year-round. It's always best to inquire first before you drop off your bulbs. *Incandescent bulbs go in the trash.*
